UNT Mayborn School of Journalism celebrates 75 years in North Texas

Summary:

The Frank W. and Sue Mayborn School of Journalism is set to celebrate its 75th anniversary in the next year. Mayborn was established in 1945 and accredited by the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication in 1969. The school of journalism received its benefactors, Frank W. and Sue Mayborn, in 2009.

Talking points:
